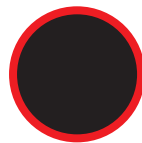
### Existences being opposed, and consist of cognition

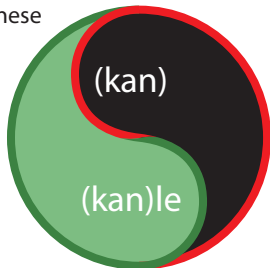


Cognitive Object
